## Facts you should know:


- Tasmania (or 'Tassie' as it is commonly called) covers most of the U.K. (see image below). It may seem small when viewing as part of the map of Australia, but Australia is very large ... Australia is almost as large as mainland U.S.A. (see image below).
- Tasmania is a STATE of Australia, just the same as Victoria and Queensland are States of Australia, or the same as California and Texas are States of the U.S.A.
- Hobart is the Capital City of Tasmania. Take a look at the photos of Hobart and Tasmania.
- Hobart is only 50 minutes flight from Melbourne and 1 hour 50 minutes flight from Sydney.
- The city of Hobart is a vibrant place well-known for its numerous wonderful restaurants, entertainment and spectacular events held throughout the year. People from all over the World visit Tasmania! Tasmania is a major tourism destination. Tasmania exports to the World oysters, crayfish, abalone, kelp, cherries, apples and wine as well as many other fruits, nuts and truffles. It also exports Lavender and Tulip bulbs. There are many award wining vineyards throughout Tasmania, wonderful beaches, and amazing forests and wilderness (world heritage areas). Tasmania was rated by New York Times as the Number 1 location in the World which has the cleanest air and the purest water! The City of Hobart was also ranked in the top 10 for the most beautiful cities in the World and easiest living cities (safe, clean, friendly).
- Education is outstanding: The Hutchins School and St Michael's School Hobart (both ABSI schools) are ranked academically within the top 1% of schools Australia. The Hutchins School is one of the oldest schools in Australia.
- Students gain 'regional points' for completing schooling in Tasmania. This means that when a student applies to enter University in Melbourne or Sydney for example, they get 'extra points' and 'extra consideration' as they have studied in Tasmania.









**Hobart Tasmania** 




